Applicant Summary Amendment

Northern Colorado Continuum of Care – published July 31, 2026

This amendment updates the FY 2026 Applicant Summary to reflect changes resulting from HUD’s publication of the FY26 Estimated Annual Renewal Demand (ARD) Report and the NoCO CoC Governing Board’s July 30, 2026 amendment to FY26 Tier 1 prioritization direction. All other provisions of the Applicant Summary and the FY26 Project Rating & Ranking Policies and Procedures remain unchanged.

Amendment 1: FY26 Funding Snapshot Update

Following HUD’s publication of the FY26 Estimated Annual Renewal Demand (ARD) Report, the funding snapshot below has been updated to reflect the ARD figures and corresponding funding allocations.

FY26 Funding Snapshot – NoCO CoC (CO-505)

- Tier 1 (Cap at 60% ARD): \$929,108
- DV Bonus: 354,653
- CoC Bonus: \$500,000
- *CoC Planning: \$88,663

* CoC Planning funds (\$88,663) are requested separately from the Priority Listing and are not included in allocated funding totals or project rankings.

Amendment 2: Revision to Tier 1 Project Prioritization

On July 30, 2026, the NoCO CoC Governing Board amended its prior FY26 direction limiting Tier 1 to essential CoC infrastructure projects and highest-ranked Permanent Supportive Housing renewal projects. Under the amended direction, after those projects have been placed in Tier 1, any remaining Tier 1 funding capacity may be applied to the next highest-ranked eligible projects on the Rating and Ranking Committee’s recommended Priority Listing.

NoCO CoC Eligible Projects by Tier for the FY26 NOFO

Tier 1 — 60% of ARD

- **Essential Infrastructure Projects (HMIS and CE/SSO-CE)**
 - These projects maintain system coordination, data quality, and HUD compliance.
- **Highest-Ranked Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) Renewal Projects**
 - PSH renewal projects will be considered for Tier 1 placement based on their ranking on the Priority Listing.
- **Remaining Tier 1 Funding Capacity**
 - After essential infrastructure projects and highest-ranked PSH renewal projects have been placed in Tier 1, any remaining Tier 1 funding capacity may be applied to the next highest-ranked eligible projects on the Rating and Ranking Committee's recommended Priority Listing.
